The competitors who take part in the race hold a pancake in a frying pan and run to the finishing line. The winner is not the person who comes first, but the person who tosses the pancake and catches it in the frying pan the biggest number of times. The most famous pancake race takes place at Olney. According to tradition, in 1445 a woman of Olney heard the church bell while she was making pancakes and did not have time to change her clothes but decided to run to the church in her apron, holding her frying pan with a pancake in her hands. The Olney Pancake Race is now world famous. Competitors have to be local housewives and they must wear an apron and a hat or scarf.
