The big parks in the centre of London were created by kings as royal gardens and hunting areas for kings and princes. The most popular royal parks are Hyde Park, Green Park, St. James's Park, Kensington Gardens, Regent's Park and Richmond Park.

So when you've finished sightseeing, take a walk in a park. You will be surprised how many animals you can see!

Hyde Park is a good place to see squirrels in the trees and people riding horses. There are also ducks and other wild birds in the lake in the middle of the park.

Richmond Park has lots of wild animals, including large numbers of red deer and foxes.

St. James's Park is famous for peacocks.

In Regent's Park there is London Zoo, one of the oldest zoos in the world, with lions, tigers, bears, hippos, monkeys, giraffes and even a giant panda. The zoo works hard to protect endangered species. London has also several city farms such as the Kentish Town City farm, where you can see sheep, pigs, cows and goats. In Trafalgar Square tourists feed thousands of pigeons.

In the summer, the parks are a favourite spot for picnics. People can sleep on the grass, sunbathe, listen to concerts and admire the beauty of the flowers, bushes and trees.



