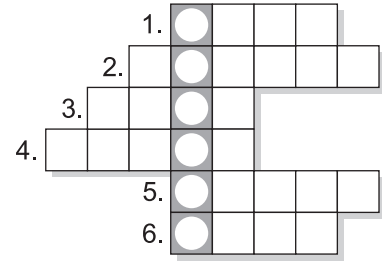

She's an Aston Villa fan.
