On Wednesday, five of the zoo's seven chimpanzees escaped from their enclosure in Furuviik, Sweden. The animals were roaming freely around the zoo. It is not yet known how they ran away. When the chimps were at large, people were said to stay indoors, lock their doors and close their windows. As a result of the zoo keepers' actions, three chimpanzees were shot dead, a fourth was wounded, and a fifth was unharmed and returned to the enclosure.

The decision to kill the chimps came in for harsh criticism on social media sites. The zoo keepers explained they had to shoot dead animals. They did not use anesthetic darts because they did not have enough time. It is necessary to wait up to 10 minutes for the tranquilizer to take effect. They didn't have that time because the animals posed a threat to human life and health, so they decided to use a gun.

According to the zoo keepers, people think chimpanzees are peaceful animals, but they are extremely dangerous. They are fast, strong, and generally fearless.
