In 1974 Ernő Rubik, a Hungarian architect and professor, made from wood, paper, and rubber bands a three-dimensional puzzle originally known as the Magic Cube, and later renamed the Rubik's Cube. The process from prototype to mass production of the Cube took over six years.

The game seems to be simple, the rules are not complex. The cube has nine coloured squares on each side, and each side has one colour: red, yellow, green, orange, blue, or white. To successfully solve the puzzle a person should twist the cube in a way so that each side turns to its original colour.

The invention became one of the most popular puzzle games in the world. It is way to have fun for everyone. It doesn't matter how old you are. There are some competitions known as Speedcubing where people try to solve the Rubik's Cube in the shortest time possible.
