The bear was not big, about 50 cm tall. Firstly, the animal seemed to be not interested in people. It just looked at them and walked away, but it returned after some time. Then the bear stood upright on its hind legs and started attacking one of the people. The man fought back. The others wanted to help him, so the teenage boy threw a sandwich at the bear to distract it. The rest started screaming and asking for help. The bear ignored the food and continued to attack the man. The man and the bear were wrestling and jumped into a cold stream. Then the man took a rock and hit the bear with it. The animal fell down and died.

When national park guards came and heard the tourists' story, they were surprised, it was hard to believe the small bear was able to attack four people. They listened to the tourists in disbelief. The investigation started, then the trial took place. According to the judge's sentence, the tourists were not in danger, so they didn't have to kill the bear. The man who had hit the bear received a suspended sentence and had to pay money to the national park. The area of mountains is a natural habitat for bears. Their attacks on people are extremely rare in Poland. When people meet bears in the mountain, they should stay calm and back away slowly.
